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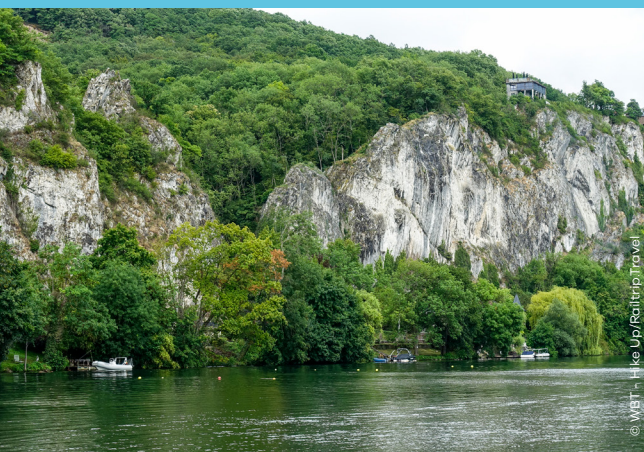
**Here you have a ready to go itinerary for a nature themed getaway for a few days in Wallonia without a car.**

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# From Namur to Dinant



## Go with the Flow

**Namur**, is a town bursting with charm. Its town centre is partially pedestrianised making it perfect for meandering through charming, bars restaurants and unique shops or for strolling by the river. In the heart of the old town you'll find lots of interesting nooks and crannies: fascinating architecture in the form of age-old churches, theatres, bell towers, even an archaeological museum. So much to see whether it's the sumptuous cathedral of **Saint Aubain**, the **churches of Saint Loup** and **Saint Jean Baptiste** or of course the famous **Citadel** which is one of the **biggest fortresses in Europe**.

From **Namur to Dinant** you're going to travel through the magnificent countryside of the Haute Meuse Valley. From the **borders of France** to the **capital of Wallonia** the river has carved out an exceptional landscape over time. In this magical valley of ancient fortresses and castles you are effortlessly transported back to different eras. From the dramatic medieval period to the 'modernity' of the Renaissance. Everywhere you go you'll find **castle strongholds, fortresses, pleasure palaces and magnificent gardens**.

«**Fille de Meuse**» or daughter of the River Meuse as **Dinant** is nicknamed is due to its particular positioning between rock and river. The town is literally wedged between the river and the rocky outcrop.

It's a dramatic setting which really does add to its charm whilst the surrounding valleys shelter a rich patrimony of majestic castles and abbeys such as the renowned '**Notre Dame de Leffe**' Abbey - home of the world-famous Belgian beer. Culturally the town is also home to several eclectic museums such as the quirky '**Maison de la Pataphonie**'. Being the birthplace of **Adolphe Sax, creator of the saxophone**, it's the natural choice for a museum dedicated to the instrument. Nature lovers will also adore this town, harbouring naturally formed wonders such as the '**Grotte La Merveille**' translated as 'wonderful cave', with its haunting underground chambers of stalagmites and stalactites and beautiful waterfalls. If you take the cable car up towards the Citadel along the river you can enjoy a leafy and lush view down below onto the banks of the Meuse river. The region is perfect for exhilarating water sport adventure such as canoeing, kayaking and electric boating. Or for something altogether more relaxing, a **river cruise** with delicious gourmet options of regionally produced fayre.

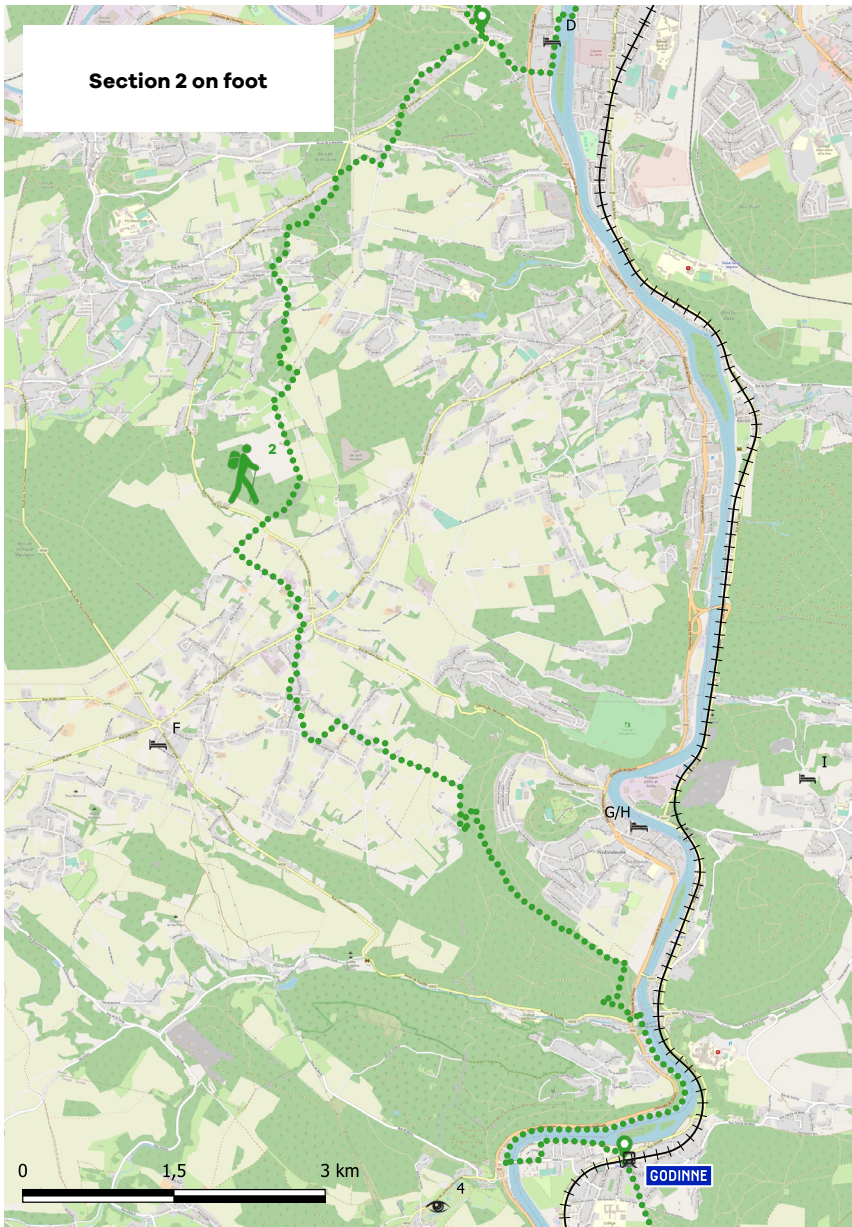
### 'Gare de Namur' (Station) – 'Avenue de la Vêcquée' (Vêcquée Avenue)

#### Signposting

GR 654 + GR 126

- 1 As you come out of the station take the zebra crossing to cross the road.
- 2 Take 'l'Avenue de la Station' (Station Street) on your left then take the path up to the Brasserie 'Le Copenhague'.
- 3 After the covered passageway continue straight on 'Rue des Carmes' (Carmes Street) where you then continue to on to the 'La Rue de L'Ouverage' (Ouverage Street).
- 4 At the crossing point, continue straight ahead on 'Rue Saint-Loup' (Saint Loup Street) where you'll see the magnificent church façade on your right.
- 5 Then take the left on 'Rue de la Croix' (Croix Street) at the end of the pedestrian street then continue right 'Rue de L'Ange' (Ange Street).
- 6 After take a left on 'Rue de Marchovelette' (Marchovelette Street) until you get to the top of 'La Place d'Armes' (Armes Square) where there is the old stock exchange then take a right on the 'Rue du Pont' (Pont Street) towards the River Sambre.
- 7 Once you've crossed the River Sambre, you'll arrive at a roundabout where you'll see the Wallonia Regional Government building on your left. Cross the street to find yourself at the foot of the Citadel.
- 8 Look out for the stairs that go to the top of the Citadel then pass by the statue « Searching for Utopia » (the turtle) by Jan Fabre.
- 9 At the foot of the stairway climb the 'La Route Merveilleuse' (the Wonderful Route) on your right. At the last set of stairs before the 'l'Esplanade de la Citadelle' (Citadel Esplanade), continue straight ahead by the treelined path 'Chemin Romagnesi' (Romagnesi Path) and follow the signposting GR 654.

## 'Avenue de la Vecquée' (Avenue Vecquée) – 'Gare de Godinne' (Godinne Station) - which you have to combine with Stage 1

### Signposting

GR 654 then GR 126

- 1 Follow the signposting GR 654 until Wépion, Profondeville or Bois de Villers - all pretty villages where we can offer accommodation suggestions. The GR 654 path will take you to the RAVeL trail on the banks of the River Meuse.
- 2 After the lock on the River Meuse don't take the GR654 which ascends on your right but continue on the RAVeL trail along the Meuse until you get to the Rouillon bridge where you can re-join GR126.
- 3 Cross the Meuse by the bridge and follow the GR signposting until Godinne station.

### Alternative you could follow Stage 2 via

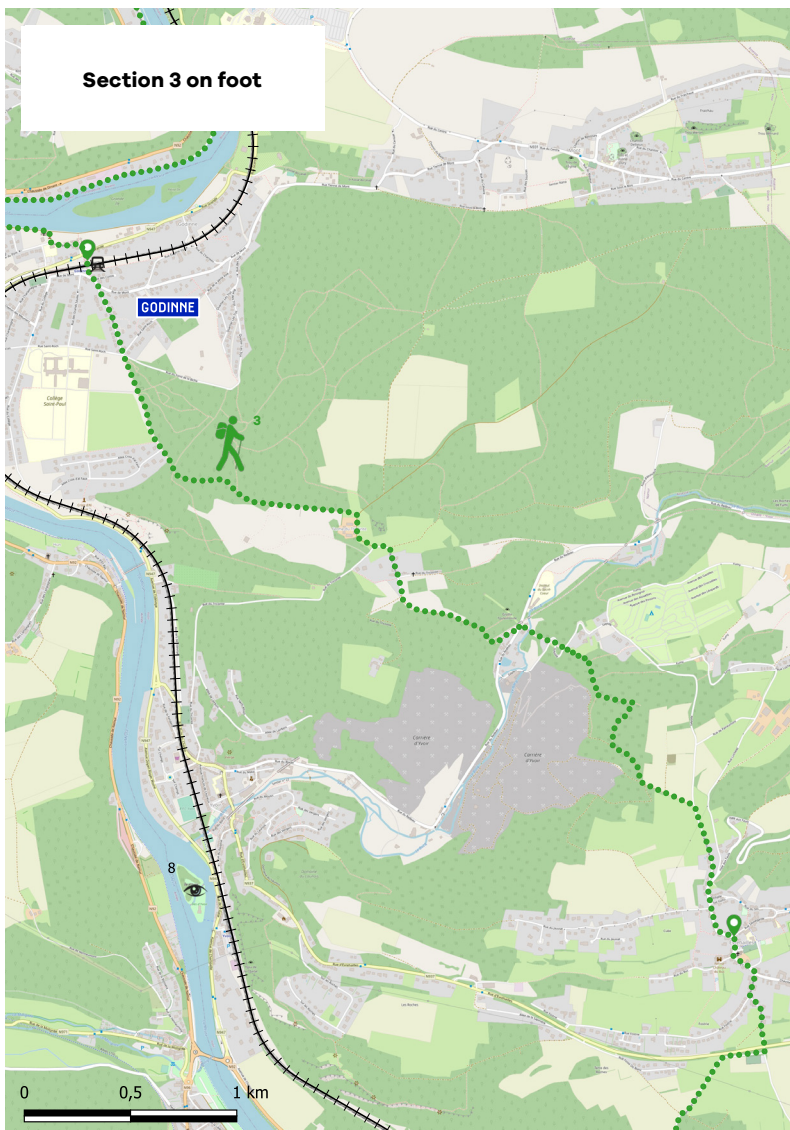
**rail:** taking your bike until you arrive at '10 de l'Avenue de la Vecquée' (10 Vecquée Avenue) where you then go down the Citadel ramparts to re-join the 'La Gare de Jambes' (Jambes Station) taking the train to the village of 'Godinne' (Godinne village) instead of on foot. (Jambes to Godinne)



- 4 To come back down from the Citadel continue on 'l'Avenue de la Vecquée' (Vecquée Avenue) and take the path that goes alongside the chapel. Follow the signposting GR 126 to the bottom until you reach Chaussée de Dinant.
- 5 Take the Chaussée de Dinant on the right for a few yards for a few metres then 'Rue Alphonse Delonnoy' (Alphonse Delonnoy Street) on the left.
- 6 At the end of the street take the RAVeL route on your left, which follows the River Meuse until you pass beside the 'Parc de la Plante' (Plant Park).
- 7 When you arrive at the lock there take the passageway to get to the other side of the River. When you get to the right side (bank) of the river, take the left along Boulevard de Meuse until 'Pont de Jambes' (Jambes Street) where you take the commercial street 'L'Avenue Materne' (Materne Avenue) on your right.
- 8 Continue straight ahead for around 1km until you reach 'La Gare de Jambes' (Jambes Station) on your right.

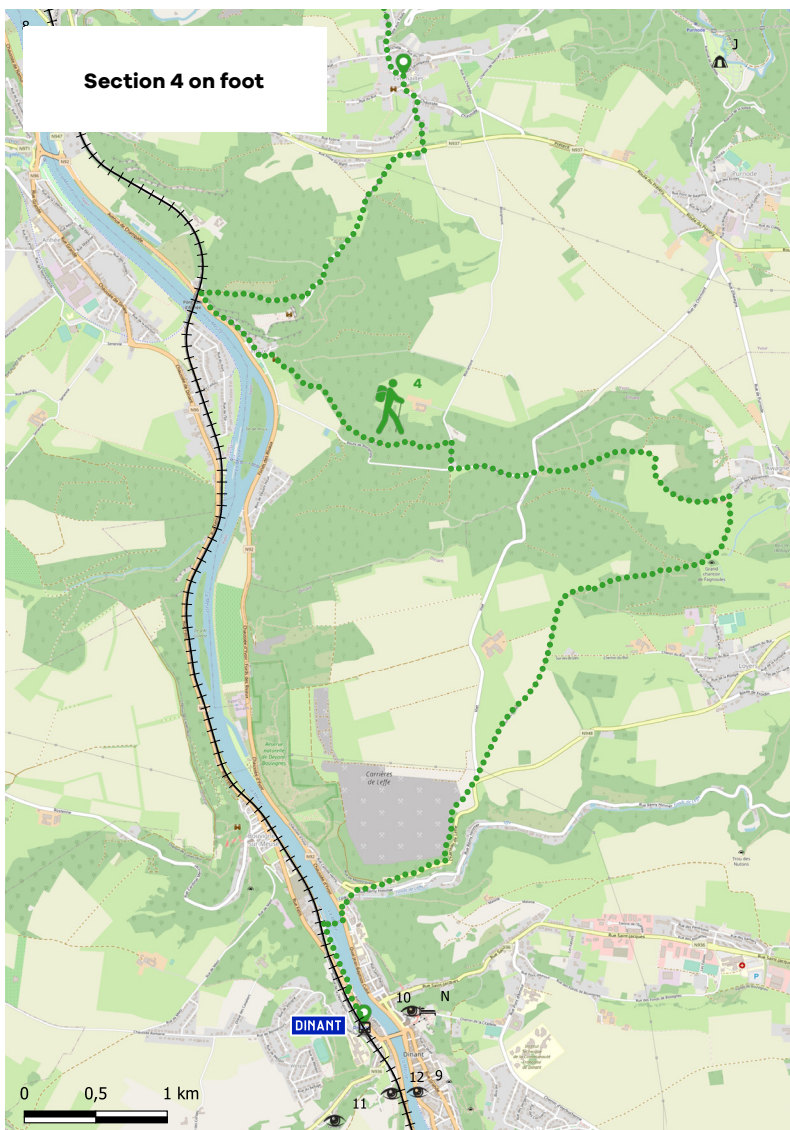

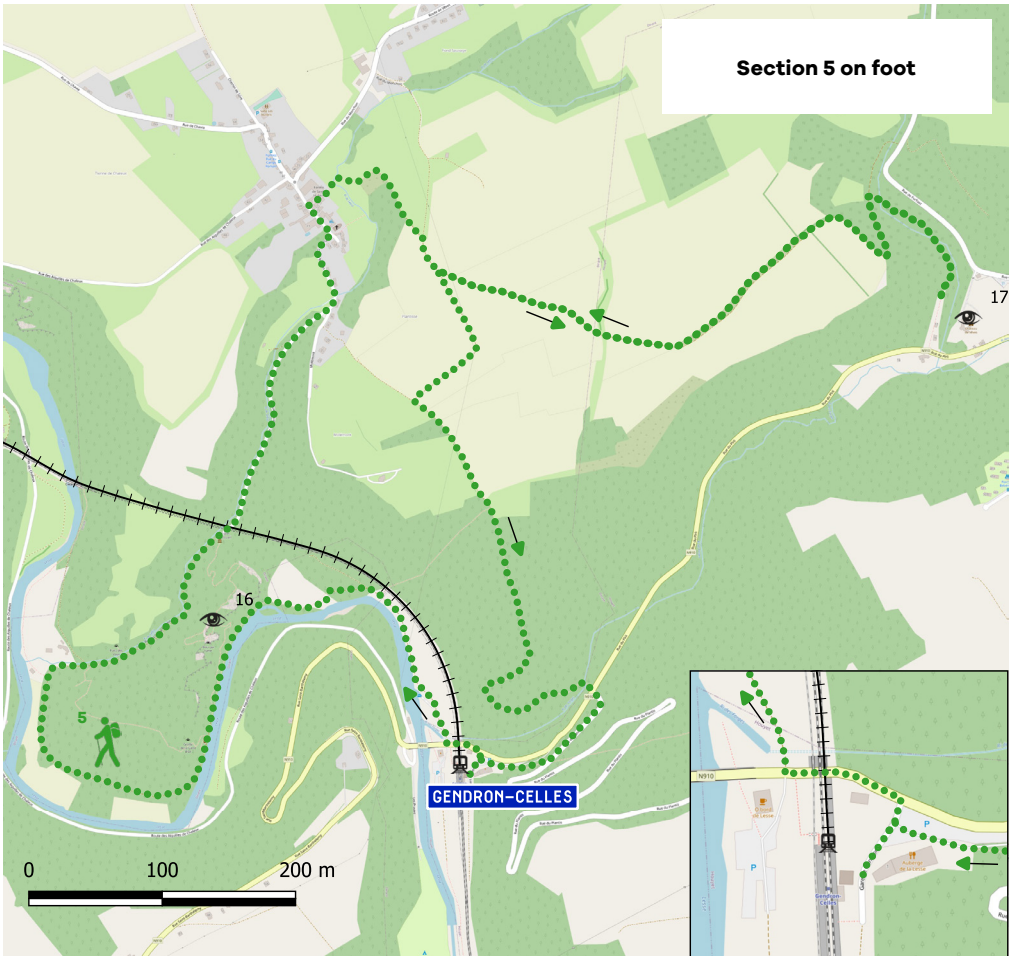

**5****'Gare de Dinant' (Station) – 'Parc de Furfooz' (Furfooz Park) – 'Gare de Dinant' (Station)**

Take the train from Dinant Station to Gendron-Celles station then walk to the 'Parc de Furfooz' (Furfooz Park) then continue until you get to 'Château de Vêves' (Vêves Castle). Then return to Gendron-Celles station to get back to Dinant. (We suggest you plan in one day for this part of the itinerary)

**Signposting**

GR 126 starting from the station

- 1 Coming out of Gendron Station, take a left towards the River Lesse then after a few metres take a right on the GR 126 following the river up to the point kayak rental company.
- 2 Following the signposting, cross the railway line and you arrive at the 'Rue du Camp Romain' (Roman Camp Street). On this street you'll find the entrance to the 'Parc Furfooz' (Furfooz Park).
- 3 After visiting the park continue on the GR towards Furfooz village.
- 4 Arriving at the village, take the right-hand path signposted 'Promenade des 4 villages' at number 24, 'Rue du Camp Romain' (24 Roman Camp Street).
- 5 By following the 'Promenade des 4 villages' signs, you arrive at the 'Château de Vêves', (Vêves Castle), near the Rue de Furfooz (Furfooz Street).
- 6 Retrace your steps to the crossroads where 'Promenade des 4 villages' and the 'Promenade de l'Aiguille de Chaleux' meet and take the path that goes downwards to the left.
- 7 Follow the signs 'Promenade de l'Aiguille de Chaleux' to 'Gendron-Celles' station and then return to Dinant by train.

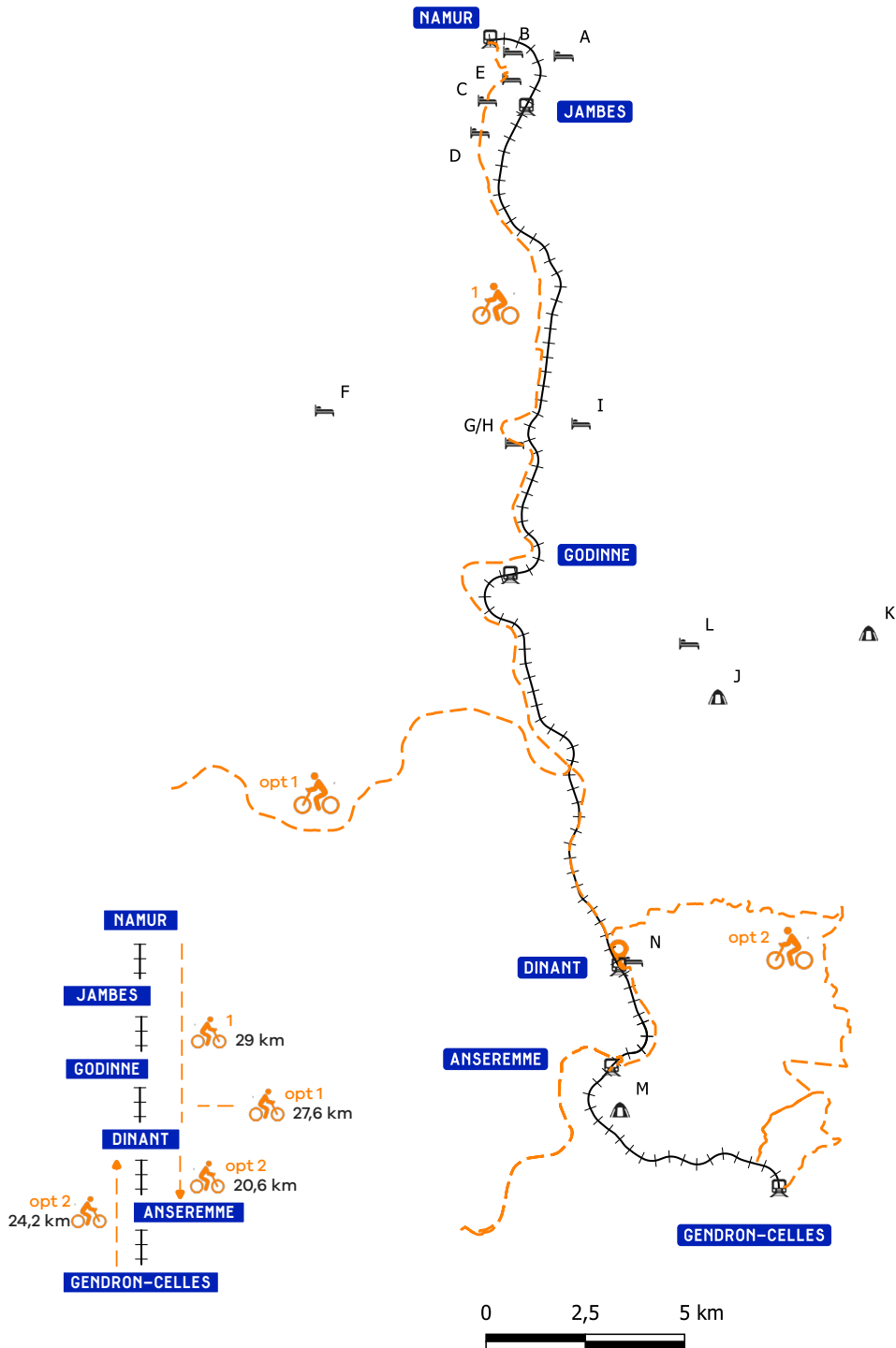

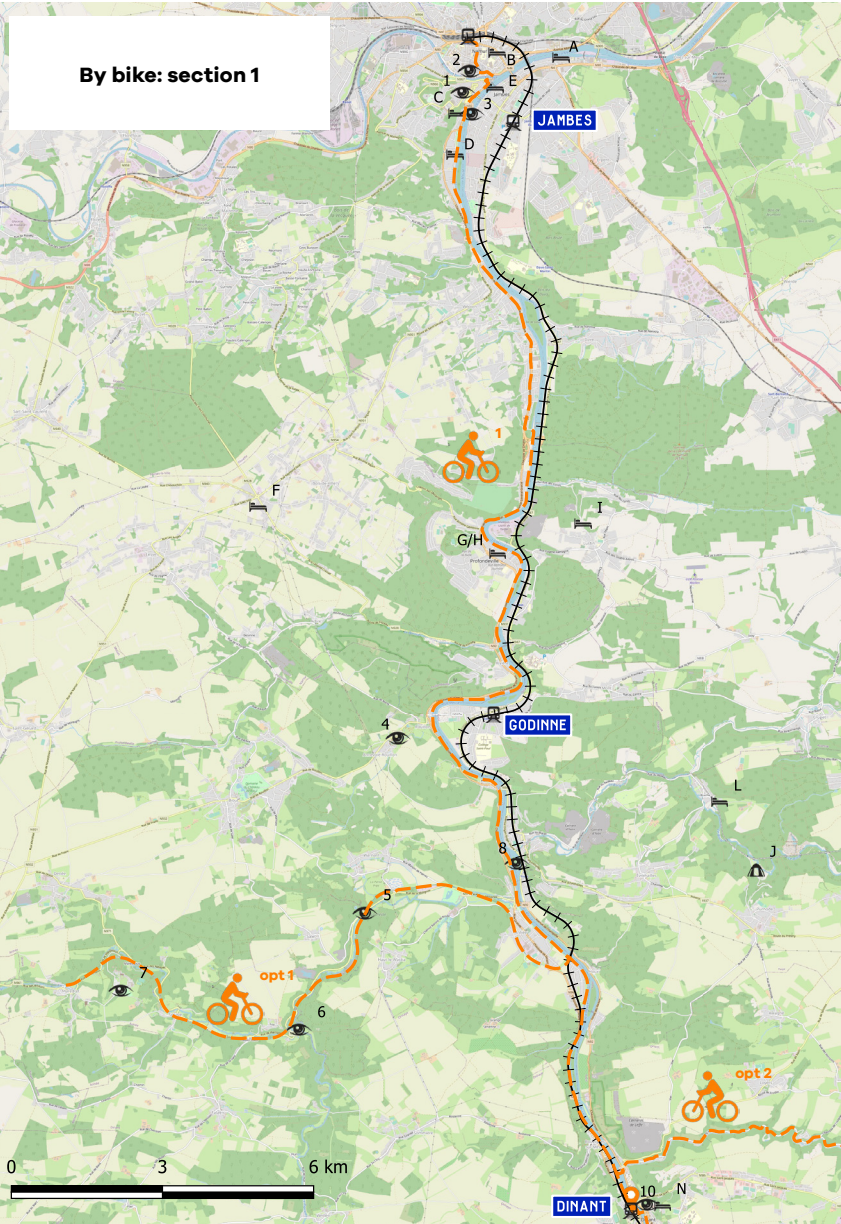

### 'Gare de Namur' (Station) – 'Gare de Dinant' (Station)

**Signposting:** Meuse à Vélo

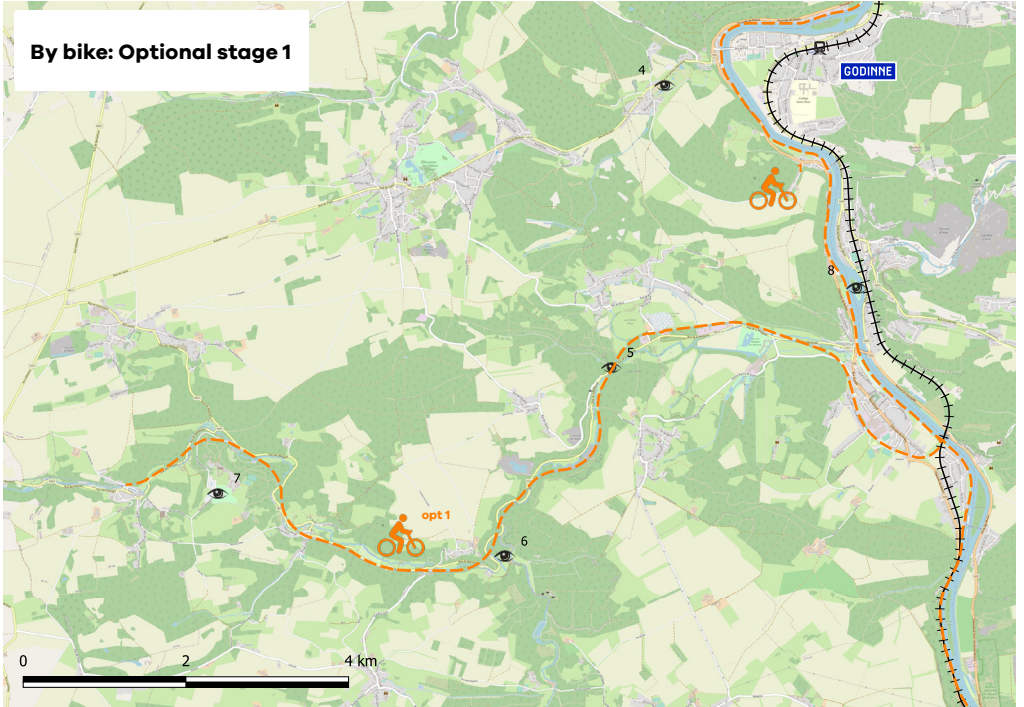


- 1 With your back to the station take 'Avenue de la Gare' (Station Street) on your left, then 'Rue de Fer' (Fer Street) directly on your right, which goes down and passes in front of the 'Hôtel de Ville de Namur' (Namur Town Hall).
- 2 Then continue on 'Avenue de l'Ange' (Ange Avenue). At the end of the Avenue, turn left into 'Rue de Marchovelette' (Marchovelette Street).
- 3 Turn right into 'Rue du Pont' (Pont Street).
- 4 When you reach the roundabout, take the last exit on the left, along the 'Saint-Gilles', which is the building that houses the Walloon Regional Parliament.
- 5 When you arrive near the 'L'Enjambée' cycle-pedestrian footbridge, go down the stairs by means of the gully to reach the 'Quai des Chasseurs Ardennes' below 'Boulevard Louis Huart'.
- 6 You are then along the River Meuse on the "Meuse à Vélo" path (EuroVelo path on the River Meuse) which you follow as far as Dinant.

*The section is designed according to the accommodation and stops suggested in this route. The sections can also be combined with the train according to your desired pace. Rail stations are almost always available at each stopping point.*

### Optional Stage 1: Molinee Valley

**Starting point:** Bord de Meuse à Anhee (at Anhee village on the River Meuse near the railway bridge)

**Signposting:** RAVeL Ligne 150

When you are on the “Meuse à Vélo” cycle trail in Anhee, just before the railway bridge, you come to a junction with another bicycle route, the RAVeL 150 route which goes on your right. It’s the part of the RAVeL route set in the stunning Molinee valley.

We suggest you take it as far as Maredret to visit the Abbey of the same name.

There are various points of interest well worth seeing on this trail: the quirky Molinee rail bikes, the Warnant Snail Farm, the Montaigle Castle ruins and the Abbey of Maredsous.

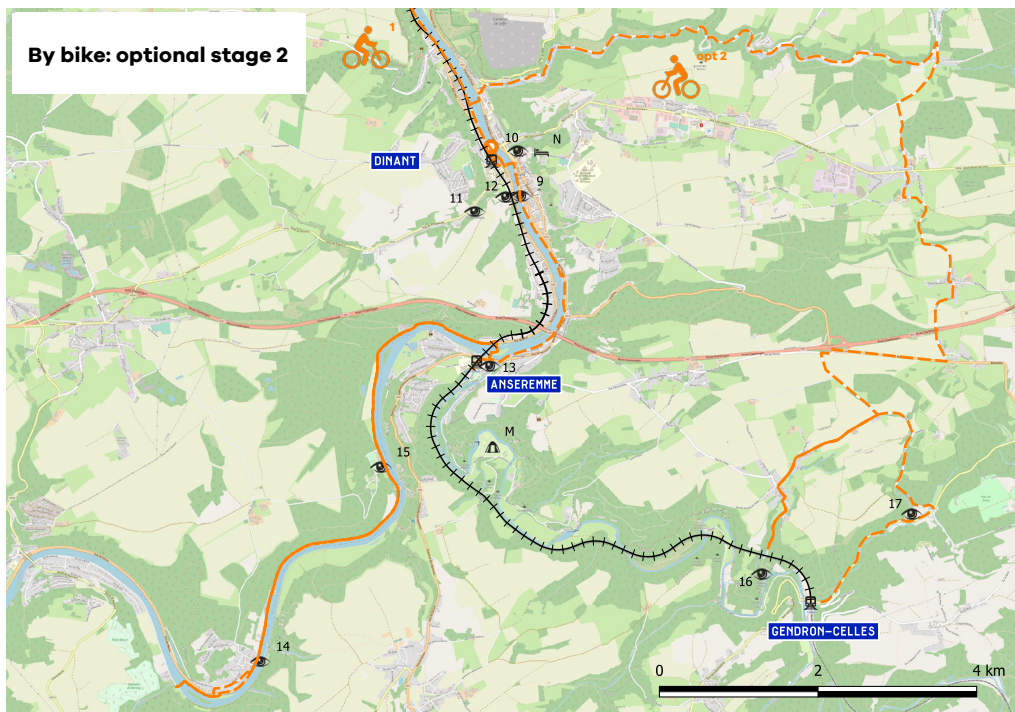
Then, the same route in the other direction to reach the starting point: the banks of the Meuse at Anhee.

We recommend a day’s visit before reaching Dinant (6 km).

## Optional Stage 2: Waulsort –Furfooz Park

**Starting point:** Pont Charles de Gaulle à Dinant (Charles de Gaulle Bridge)

**Signposting** Meuse à Vélo  + RV2

It is possible to enjoy this adventure in just **one day** but you'll have to make a decision on which activities and places to choose.

**If you want to visit the 'Château de Freÿr' (Freÿr Castle) for instance, take a picnic in Waulsort and take the little ferry boat at the same time. Or visit the 'Château de Vêves' (Vêves Castle) and the 'Parc Furfooz' (Furfooz Park) you will need two days to really savour this itinerary by sleeping an extra night in Dinant.**

### Day 1:

- 1 Leave from Dinant following the signs of the «Meuse à Vélo» towards Hastière and Givet villages as far as Waulsort village, passing by Château de Freÿr (Freÿr castle) on the way.
- 2 When you arrive in Waulsort village, you can make a stop at the picnic area near the picturesque Waulsort lock.
- 3 Then, we suggest that you return by the same path towards Dinant but stopping at 'Gare Anseremme' (Anseremme station). To get to Anseremme station: after the lock footbridge, turn directly to the right and then to the left twice to arrive on 'Rue des Tilleuls' (Tilleuls Street) where the station is located.

### Day 2:

- 2 Take the train towards Gendron-Celles station (from Dinant or Anseremme depending on departure point).
- 2 At the station exit, turn right on the RV2 (Rando Velo 2 trail) towards Vêves village.
- 3 Take the 'Rue de Furfooz' (Furfooz Street) (still on the RV2 markings), where you will pass in front of the romantic 'Château de Vêves' (Vêves' castle).
- 4 After the castle, continue on 'Rue de Furfooz' (Furfooz Street) and the RV2 for 2.7 km until you reach a crossroads and a hamlet.
- 5 Take the 'Route de Vêves' on the left and leave the RV2 markings.
- 6 Continuing on the 'Route de Vêves', take the 'Rue du Monchon' (Monchon Street). You will then arrive at Furfooz village.
- 7 At the church, take 'Rue du Camp Romain' (Roman Camp Street) to the entrance to 'Parc de Furfooz' (Furfooz Street).
- 8 After your visit to the park, return by the same path to the intersection between Route de Vêves and Rue de Furfooz. On the left, take the RV2 in the direction of Dinant for 20 km.



# Discover

## 1 The Citadel of Namur and its underground passages

Listed as a Walloon heritage, the Citadel offers a breathtaking view of the city. You will also appreciate the impressive underground passages with their atmospheric lighting and visit the Terra-Nova Visitor Centre. The surrounding green spaces also make the Citadel a source of nature in the heart of the town– a popular place for walks, cycling and picnics. For amateurs, a small train guides you through the site.

## 2 Historic pedestrian centre of Namur, Namourette (rickshaw tours)

The old quarters give the town a village feel, with a special atmosphere. They are entirely pedestrianized with shops, bars and restaurants. The alleys are also punctuated by architectural treasures such as the Belfry or the Saint-Aubain cathedral. Want to discover the city in an original way? Test the fun way of seeing the sites with a quirky rickshaw tour or ‘La Namourette’ as it’s known.

## 8 Île d'Yvoir (Yvoir island)

In its superb green setting of 2.5 hectares, 'île d'Yvoir' (Yvoir Island) is the only island in Belgium to be exploited for tourist purposes. An automated water ferryman invites you to join its chill out zone, its terrace, tavern style restaurant and all the great activities (paddling pool, kayaks, pedal boats, water skiing or jet-skiing).

## 9 Dinant

Often known as 'Fille de Meuse' (Daughter of the Meuse), Dinant takes its nickname from its unique location between its cliffs and the River Meuse. The town is literally embedded between the two, which gives it all its charm.

On the cultural side, the city has eclectic museums like the Maison de la Pataphonie. Birthplace of the famous Adolphe Sax, the creator of the saxophone, it devotes its space to the instrument and to its inventor it has an information centre, the 'Maison de Monsieur Sax'.

In Hastière, the Renaissance-style Château de Freÿr, surrounded by magnificent gardens, is classified as an Exceptional Heritage of Wallonia. The site, bordered by the River Meuse, is nestled in a magnificent hilly setting. The 350-year-old Orange trees box planted in the gardens are a particular delight, their citrusy scent filling the air as you stroll in this divine place.
