
This brochure provides all you need for a few days in Wallonia without a car.

It forms part of a series of interconnectable routes. By combining these short stays, you'll have an easy to follow way of spending wonderful sustainable adventures in Wallonia. These itineraries always start from a station with the following options to continue the train and by bike or by train and on foot.

Travelling in **slow tourism** mode gives you time to enjoy the landscapes, take in surrounding nature, local products, visits and warm hospitality.

From Gouvy to Aywaille



Get ready for a magical ecotourism stay in the heart of the Ardennes

This itinerary will take you from the Luxembourg border to the Liège region, from the **Salm Valley to the Amblève valley**. Begin your adventure at **Gouvy** village located at the extreme – northern tip of the Luxembourg region – a beautiful concoction of green landscapes, forests and crystal clear rivers. It's a wonderful area for nature lovers with **eleven bird life reserves** in the region.

After leaving Gouvy, on foot, taking the GRP 571 you'll quickly arrive at the **Val de Salm**, a sub-basin of the Amblève. You will then pass by the pretty village of **Salmchâteau** which takes part of its name to this small stream - the Salm. By bike after Gouvy, you then head further east towards **Saint-Vith** to then join the Salm valley.

Then, whether you are on foot or by bike, you'll discover **Vielsalm**, known for its geological riches. With almost every step you will encounter rare rocks - unique in the world. Malachite, ottrelite, ardennite, vantasselite, quartz crystals, turquoise..., even gold! There is also the famous coticule which is used for « *razor stones* ». There's even a museum dedicated to them.

On foot, you'll then reach **Trois-Ponts** with its magnificent view from the 16,65 metres high Tour Leroux. After crossing Trois-Ponts, the Salm flows into the Amblève. On foot or by bike, you'll be blown away by this exceptional valley and its magnificent river. Its source is found in this exceptional valley on the borders of the **Hautes-Fagnes-Eifel Nature Park**, digging its deep bed in a valley with steep slopes. The Amblève flows from a height of 15 metres. Don't miss the **Coo waterfall**, a major site in Wallonia and the highest natural waterfall in Belgium.


This waterway truly is the gift that keeps on giving. It conceals a magical place called the **Fonds de Quarreux**. A 1,5 km walk along the river reveals these mysterious rounded rocks and the legends around this fantastic place. Further on, you'll visit yet another natural gem: '**Les Grottes de Remouchamps**' (caves), where tourists can enjoy the longest underground navigation in the world. A true spectacle before arriving in **Aywaille**, your final destination.


General map & itineraries

What's the concept of this slow tourism route?

It's a combination of train journeys and sections to be taken on foot or by bike. The different stages proposed are in accordance with the accommodation and sights suggested in this route. The sections can of course be combined with the train depending on the desired pace. Stations are available at pretty much every section.



Our tips for travelling more easily by train



- Buy your tickets via the **app, ticket offices** or **vending machines**.
If you travel by bicycle, don't forget that you will need to buy a ticket for **each bike** (4€ per trip).
On the vending machine the bike ticket is in 'supplement'.
Folding bikes travel free.
- Arrive early to have time to settle with your bike. Small stations are usually relatively well suited for transporting a bicycle from platform to the other. In the largest stations, traveling with a bicycle is more complex and requires a little more time.
- Wheel your **bike by hand** in the station, on the platforms and on the train.
- **Speak to the train conductor** before boarding: he will tell you, (often with a smile), if there are still places available and in which part of the train they are. More and more trains are **equipped with a pictogram indicating the location of the compartment/space dedicated to bicycles**.
- Remove your bags and do not place your bike against a toilet or in front of an access door.
- Bring a **lock**: you will be able to travel sitting down even if there is no space next to your bike.
- Travel outside peak hours, this will allow you more a more comfortable journey on the go.
- Anticipate getting off in advance this will save you stress and make it easier for other travelers to get off.
- **'Bruxelles-Central', 'Bruxelles-Chapelle' and 'Bruxelles-Congrès' (Station) are prohibited for bicycles.**
- Choose accommodation that has bed and bath linen and offers you a solution for breakfast (on site, pastry basket delivery, nearby bakery, etc.), so you can **travel light**.
- Make sure you can eat where you sleep or in the immediate vicinity. After a day of hiking or cycling, you will not necessarily want to get back in road for your evening meal.







Start your journey with a visit to the pretty village of Gouvy

- 1 At Gouvy station, when the station is behind you, go up 'Rue de la Gare' on your left then at the 'L'Epicure', bakery, cross the bridge on your left.
- 2 After crossing the bridge, take the first street on your right (gas supplier J. Jamotton-Premont').
- 3 You are on GRP 571, follow the yellow and red signposting to Vielsalm.

Attention, be careful when crossing the intersection of 'Rue des Comtes de Salm' in Salmchâteau.




Vielsalm (Rencheux) – ‘Gare de Trois-Ponts’ (Station)

Signposting

GRP 571  and GR 14 

- 1 From Rencheux in ‘Rue des Chasseurs Ardennais’ follow GRP 571 to 31,25 km in the forest. When on the forest path, you’ll see the GRP 571 goes on your left on a small path which goes down towards Trois-Ponts. **Don’t take it.** Continue the forest path up to the ridge where you will come across the GR 14 which you will take on your left towards the Tour Leroux.
- 2 At Tour Leroux, follow the GR 14. You’ll arrive at Trois-Ponts station.

- 2 Follow the GRP 571 signposts to Petit-Coo and 'Rue Pierre Clerdent' where Coo station is located.






With or without internet, the Cirkwi mobile application embeds all their content, maps, texts, images, etc. This allows them to be used anywhere and in any weather.



'Gare de Gouvy' (Station) – Saint-Vith

Start your journey by visiting the pretty village of Gouvy

- 1 At Gouvy station, turn left and follow the connecting route towards St-Vith. Go over the bridge over the tracks and continue to the village of Gouvy. Turn left and follow the connecting path towards St-Vith.
- 2 Follow the connection in the direction of St-Vith to the 'VennBahn' in Huldange.
- 3 At Huldange, take the 'Vennbahn' and follow the route to Saint-Vith ('point-nœud' 84).



Saint-Vith – 'Gare de Vielsalm' (Station)

- 1 From junction 84, continue on the 'VennBahn' in the direction of Monschau / Aachen to 'point-nœud' 32.
- 2 Turn left on the RAVeL L47a towards Vielsalm.
- 3 At 'point-nœud' 88, continue straight ahead in the direction of Vielsalm station or follow the direction of 'point-nœud' 84 to the right to go to the next section.







'Gare de Vielsalm' (Station) – Francorchamps

- 1 From Vielsalm station, join line L47a and go up to 'point-noeud' 88.
- 2 Turn left towards 'Mont-Le-Soie' following 'point-noeuds' 84 - 80 - 02.
- 3 In Stavelot, from 'point-noeud' 02, you go back and forth to the Coo waterfall following 'points noeuds' 85 and 86 and then return by the same path.
Then you follow the RAVeL L44a directly towards Francorchamps following points 03 – 04.

(You can also avoid the return trip to the waterfall by following point-noeud 03 and 04 directly to Francorchamps from 'point-noeud' 02).

Francorchamps – ‘Gare d’Aywaille’ (Station)

- 1 In Francorchamps, from ‘point-noeud’ 04, follow the signposting to reach ‘point-noeud’ 91 via ‘Route de Neuville’.
- 2 Arrived at ‘point-noeud’ 91, get ready to face the formidable climb towards Andrimont and ‘point-noeud’ 92.
- 3 Follow the following ‘point-noeuds’: 16 - 15 - 14 - 13 - 12 - 11 - 8 - 7 - 6 - 5 - 46 - 45.
- 4 In Aywaille, before ‘point-noeud’ 45, cross the Amblève river to reach the station on the other bank.

1 Sentier pieds nus de la Ferme de la Planche (Barefoot Path)

From the Ferme de la Planche (farm), in the village of Montleban you'll find an unusual 3,5 km experience in the form of a sensory barefoot path. It's a multi-sensory experience triggered by contact with stone, earth, water or wood. On your way, you also come across many animals such as cattle, alpacas, horses and donkeys.

You can also embark on an 'Intrigue on the farm' walk: with your smartphone or tablet as your tool, challenging you to solve all the puzzles.

5 La balade des « Trésors du Pays de Salm » (Nature Walk)

This walk takes you along a wild and preserved path through one of the most beautiful nature reserves in the region. You will also discover extraordinary sites - archaeological and historical witnesses of the region's rich past. Also the fascination behind the stories of forgotten millstones: the galleries of the slate workers or the traces of the gold diggers before arriving at the famous 'Musée du Coticule' (Coticule Museum).

Begin your walk on the 'Place de Salm-Château' in front of the church, towards Bèche.

6 Le lac des Doyards (Lake)

This 2 km walk in the enchanting and idyllic setting of Lac des Doyards is a relaxing way to spend a rejuvenating and fun time with your family. 13 L'Abbaye de Stavelot

During its 14 centuries of existence, the Abbey has welcomed monks (from the 7th to the 18th centuries), revolutionaries, master tanners, municipal administration, museums and cultural venues. The building is classified as '*Exceptional Heritage of Wallonia*'.

You can visit:

- The Historical Museum of the Principality of Stavelot-Malmedy educates the public on the architectural and historical heritage
 - The Galerie Triangle Bleu installed since 2004 in part of the buildings is well known beyond Belgium
 - The Guillaume Apollinaire Museum
 - The Circuit de Francorchamps Museum
- But also: temporary exhibitions, the archaeological remains of the 11th century abbey church, a museum shop, a tavern...

14 Stavelot Plage (Beach)

A magnificent nature site on the banks of the Amblève a few hundred metres from the historic centre of Stavelot. The ideal place for a walk or a barbecue.

From the Belle Epoque until the 1960s and 1970s, it was a favorite of Stavelotians and tourists... Today, the site has been reborn into a beautiful relaxation and barbecue area.

15 Coo Waterfalls and the Natural Lake

A major site in Wallonia, the Coo waterfall is the highest natural waterfall in Belgium. A few kilometres from Stavelot, the Amblève flows from a height of 15 metres. A 5 km walk around the lake: in the heart of nature, allows you to discover the lake and its fauna (ducks, water hens...) and the forest with its beautiful vegetation and insects, butterflies, bees, birds...

Visited by tourists since 1828, the Wonder of Wonders has the only navigable underground river in Belgium, the Rubicon. Check out the bats or the Sottais, small mysterious creatures living in the rocks of the caves.

THE « CLÉ VERTE » AND « BIENVENUE VÉLO » LABELS



Clé Verte (or Green Key in English) is an international eco-label that merits tourist establishments for their approaches and their performance in terms of the environment. In concrete terms, establishments with the Clé Verte label have reduced their ecological footprint by limiting their energy and water consumption, as well as their waste production; using more environmentally friendly cleaning products; by offering organic, local, fair trade food products, etc. And this, without the experience or comfort of their customers or their guests being affected.
