It forms part of a series of interconnectable routes. By combining these short stays, you'll have an easy to follow way of spending wonderful sustainable adventures in Wallonia. These itineraries always start from a station with the following options to continue the train and by bike or by train and on foot.

Travelling in **slow tourism** mode gives you time to enjoy the landscapes, take in surrounding nature, local products, visits and warm hospitality.



From Brussels to Liège



Enjoy the Hesbaye region between clear skies, mills and charming farms

This multi day getaway will take you between **Brussels and Liège** north of the Meuse in the Hesbaye region, known for its **agricultural landscapes** and wide open horizons. Nicknamed **'Belgium's bread-basket'**, this pretty rural region, is as poetic as it's open landscape which offers unlimited skyscapes and a mosaic of patchwork fields. Brabant Hesbaye and Liège are characterized by **old town centres** where traces of their Medieval history are still everywhere: in farms, castles and Romanesque churches...


Start your adventures with **Hélécine and its famous castle** located in a magnificent 28 hectares park, perfect for walks, picnics, games and barbecues. In the castle grounds, there's a nice brasserie with a riverside terrace to enhance the holiday atmosphere. You can even sample the Château d'Hélécine beer, brewed at the nearby Jandrain-Jandrenouille brewery.


After your castle visit you cross the town of **Orp-Jauche** - known in **particular for 'boudin vert'** or 'green pudding'. Then the **Hannut** plateau will offer you an extensive view over the **Walloon farmlands** - some of the most monumental of the region. After passing the Hannut region, you will reach the magnificent Geer valley, scattered with large meadows dotted with poplars and willows. **The Geer** is one of the main tributaries on the left bank of the Meuse, meandering to the marvelous Moulin Castral of Hollogne-Sur-Geer (Windmill). This beautiful route is punctuated by several nature reserves such as 'Paradise in Orp-le-Petit' or 'Haut-Geer'.

The regions low relief landscapes easily **accessible at all levels** create a relaxing and enjoyable route with unexpected surprises along the way.















What's the concept of this slow tourism route?

It's a combination of train journeys and sections to be taken on foot or by bike. The different stages proposed are in accordance with the accommodation and sights suggested in this route. The sections can of course be combined with the train depending on the desired pace. Stations are available at pretty much every section.


4 trains per hour serve the route from Brussels:

- 2 fast trains (Brussels-Leuven-Liège-Guillemins, one of which stops at Ans)
- 1 omnibus between Brussels and Liège-Guillemins (to connect Waremme and Ans, ends of the hiking and cycling routes)
- 1 omnibus between Brussels and Landen (to connect Brussels and Ezemaal)


On all these lines, it is possible to travel on-board with your bikes: €4/bike/journey + ticket price.

- Buy your tickets via the app, ticket offices or vending machines.
 - If you travel by bicycle, don't forget that you will need to buy a ticket for **each bike** (4€ per trip).
 - On the vending machine the bike ticket is in 'supplement'. Folding bikes travel free.
- Arrive early to have time to settle with your bike. Small stations are
 usually relatively well suited for transporting a bicycle from platform
 to the other. In the largest stations, traveling with a bicycle is more
 complex and requires a little more time.
- Wheel your **bike by hand** in the station, on the platforms and on the train.
- Speak to the train conductor before boarding: he will tell you, (often with a smile), if there are still places available and in which part of the train they are. More and more trains are equipped with a pictogram indicating the location of the compartment/space dedicated to bicycles.
- Remove your bags and do not place your bike against a toilet or in front of an access door.
- Bring a lock: you will be able to travel sitting down even if there is no space next to your bike.
- Travel outside peak hours, this will allow you more a more comfortable journey on the go.
- Anticipate getting off in advance this will save you stress and make it easier for other travelers to get off.
- 'Bruxelles-Central', 'Bruxelles-Chapelle' and 'Bruxelles-Congrès' (Station) are prohibited for bicycles.
- Choose accommodation that has bed and bath linen and offers you a solution for breakfast (on site, pastry basket delivery, nearby bakery, etc.), so you can travel light.
- Make sure you can eat where you sleep or in the immediate vicinity.
 After a day of hiking or cycling, you will not necessarily want to get back in road for your evening meal.



- 3 When you arrive at 'Rue de Vieille Cense', take the 'Chemin du Diable' signpost on your left, marker vellow and red GRP 127 'Tour du Brabant wallon' where you'll pass in front of a beautiful residence
- Follow GRP 127 'Tour du Brabant wallon' for 10.85 km until vou reach 'Rue Joseph Jadot' and the magnificent 'Château Rose'.








- 1 Take 'Rue du Centre Bernadette' to the left (don't follow the GR veering off to the right).
- Walk in the direction Geer and the river. When you've passed the bridge, take the cement path to the right along the length of the river ('Promenade du Geer').
- 3 Follow the signposting for 'Point Noeud' 30, continue along 'Promenade du Geer' direction 'Point Noeud' 32 you'll pass landmarks such as the 'Haut-Geer Nature Reserve'.
- 4 Until you arrive into the 'Rue du Centre' opposite the school and its coloured railings, take the street to the left for 240 metres. You'll notice the beautiful windmill, 'Moulin Castral' de Hollogne-sur-Geer on the left.

- Then, you leave the 'Rue du Centre' on the right by the 'Rue Léonard Lacroix', which you take for 750 metres to a large crossroads with the national.
- 6 Cross the national road and take the 'Chemin de la Campagne' which veers off to the right.
- 7 At the top of the road, turn right onto 'Rue Longchamps'.
- From this crossroads, you then follow the yellow and blue RV4 markers (hiking-cycling) to the bridge below the railway in Waremme.
- After crossing the bridge, take the footpath to the right that runs directly along the railway track to the station.





- Follow points 57 5 6 7 1 98 97. You can then cross the village of Hélécine and join the RAVeL L147.
- 3 Follow points 69-19 where you leave the RAVeL at L147 to join the point 22 to take RAVeL L127 towards Hannut.

- Follow points 22 23 24 25 29. When you reach point 29, leave the RAVeL L127 to follow the Geer valley to Waremme.
- 5 Follow points 26 27 28 -30 -32 35 and take the direction of point 36 to reach Waremme station.

Hexaoda, the Jean Leclercq insectarium, is the only museum in Wallonia to offer you a scientific and fun journey into the fascinating world of insects. Educational but fun modules take visitors of all ages on a journey of exciting insect discovery. You can prolong the visit through 2500 m² of stunning flower gardens specially chosen to attract a multitude of native insects from the area. There are also 17 km of ecological trails and a greenhouse for butterflies and other native insects (locusts, grasshoppers, ladybugs...).

The Owl Distillery produces 100% Belgian Single Malt Whisky, The Belgian Owl, voted best single malt whisky in Europe. You can also take a guided tour, lasting 1 or 2 hours, admire authentic and majestic Scottish stills during your visit observing the process from barley cultivation (land to glass). Montagne de Bueren (Heritage staircase)

The Montagne de Bueren tops the charts in the list of ten most spectacular staircases in the world. Its 374 steps staircase with a 30% inclination is permanently open to the public and is often at the centre of major events including 'La Nocturne des Coteaux de la Citadelle' (a lively nocturnal event) and 'Bueren in Bloom'(floral festival). It's definitely a must when visiting the city of Liège. At the foot of the Bueren mountain, check out Brasserie C - dedicated to the regional Walloon beers and produce.



THE « CLÉ VERTE » AND « BIENVENUE VÉLO » LABELS

Clé Verte (or Green Key in English) is an international eco-label that merits tourist establishments for their approaches and their performance in terms of the environment.
